

Cryoanalgesia

Cryoanalgesia is a method of relieving pain by freezing the affected nerve, causing an interruption of pain impulses to the brain
The procedure is usually performed to relieve pain from peripheral nerves (nerves that connect the brain or spinal column to areas outside the central nervous system). It can be performed to treat certain types of headaches, painful scars, as well as some types of back pain. This treatment is usually performed after a diagnostic procedure involving local anesthetic (numbing medication) and a cortisone derivative (anti-inflammatory medication) has shown at least temporary relief of symptoms.
Depending on the area affected, you will be asked to either sit or lie down on the exam table in the procedure room. A small needle is used to inject a local anesthetic (numbing medication) to numb the skin. Then a small incision is made into the skin, and a small probe is inserted into the area. Occasionally ultrasound may be used to assist in proper placement. With the probe in place, a machine connected to the probe will be turned on and a small ball of ice will form around the tip of the probe. Freezing the nerve results in an interruption of the transmission of the pain impulse. The probe is removed and a small band aid is applied if needed.

The procedure takes 5 to 10 minutes. You will be able to leave immediately following the procedure.
The risks of this procedure include , but are not limited to : * Pain in the area where the needle(s) was inserted, this can last for two to three days. This can be treated by using ice and mild analgesics (pain medication) such as Motrin, Naprosyn or Tylenol. * Punctured lung resulting in lung collapse (pneumothorax). This may require hospitalization and insertion of a chest tube. * Bleeding in the injection area. * Infection in the injection area. * Increased pain * Nerve damage, paralysis, stroke and even death.
